Aims & Objectives



Our core objectives encompass an array of vital actions. We are committed to offering sanctuary and medical attention to aged, injured, pregnant, and ailing donkeys. Our efforts extend to organising vaccination and deworming camps for donkeys, bolstering the capacity of Local Health Providers, bridging the divide between governmental veterinary clinics and local communities through multi-level advocacy, and orchestrating comprehensive dog sterilisation camps. Through these initiatives, we endeavour to foster a harmonious coexistence between humans and animals while addressing critical animal welfare needs.

What We Do

Our comprehensive initiatives coalesce with a singular vision: to elevate the status of donkeys by adhering to the cardinal Five Freedoms of Equine welfare. These Freedoms epitomise our commitment, guiding every facet of our work to ensure the holistic well-being of every donkey entrusted to us.

- Ensure freedom from hunger and thirst.
- Provide freedom from discomfort.
- Guarantee freedom from pain, injuries, and diseases.
- Enable freedom to express natural behaviour.
- Uphold freedom from fear and distress.





Operational Scope

- Comprehensive Medical Support DDS is a crucial resource, extending critical medical aid to equines within the equine family during accidents, convalescence from skin ailments, wound recuperation, sterilisation, tetanus, and digestive distress. Our accomplished Veterinary and Livestock officers spearhead these interventions.
- Empowerment Through Education We undertake an active role in imparting equine owners with invaluable insights into welfare best practices, nurturing a culture of informed and conscientious care.
- Enhancing Provider Proficiency Through meticulous strategies, we fortify the proficiency of local service providers, including Livestock Health Practitioners, government veterinary officers, Ashwamitra personnel, and equine attendants.
- Holistic Veterinary Care Our mission's cornerstone entails delivering immediate emergency and routine, exceptional-quality veterinary interventions to working equines, ensuring their optimal health and well-being.
- **Policy Advocacy and Stakeholder Engagement** DDS diligently forges robust relationships with policy influencers, effectively advocating for equine welfare and galvanising support at the policymaker level.

Medical Camps

In the past year, our organisation conducted four camps in the villages of Sagroli, Hingani, Kasrali, and Loha, addressing the needs of 185 donkeys and supporting 57 donkey owners in the Nanded district and its vicinity. The focus of our efforts was on general health check-ups, deworming, and vaccinations. Additionally, we attended to cases of wounded donkeys, as well as those subjected to abuse and inhumane treatment. Alongside providing necessary treatment, we conducted educational sessions to raise awareness among donkey owners about common diseases, prevention strategies, and overall care practices.

Additionally, we handle cases related to various diseases and wounds, offering medical attention and treatment to ensure the well-being of the animals under our care.

Tackling LSD

LSD = Lumpy Skin Disease

a contagious viral infection affecting cattle, characterized by fever, nodules on the skin, and general discomfort, often leading to reduced milk production and economic losses in the livestock industry.

In our annual initiatives, Dharma Donkey Sanctuary partnered with SSM's Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Sagroli, to launch a targeted Lumpy Skin Disease (LSD) Awareness Campaign, prompted by LSD detection in certain Maharashtra regions, including our operational areas. This comprehensive campaign educated farmers in key villages of Biloli Taluka and Deglaur Taluka, such as Sagroli, Daulatapur, Dongaon, Bamni, and Adampur. Through structured sessions, farmers gained vital insights into LSD transmission, symptoms, preventive measures, and immediate first aid protocols. We stressed the urgency of reporting any lumpy-like symptoms to nearby veterinary clinics promptly. Thanks to these efforts and active farmer involvement, the campaign successfully halted the spread of LSD in the region. This accomplishment not only protected our community's animals but also highlighted the significance of collaborative endeavors in enhancing animal health and welfare, reinforcing our commitment to the well-being of the animals we serve.
